Cookies Disclaimer and Cookies Policy

The International Finance Asia Ltd. website may use "cookies" to collect information about your use of the website. This Cookies Disclaimer and Cookies Policy provides users of our website with information on our use of cookies when you visit our website. It also provides information on how users may block the use of cookies when they visit this website. Users should also be familiar with our Privacy Policy.

A cookie is a small data file that is stored on your computer to make it easier for you to use and navigate our website. For example, cookies may remember a client's ID, passwords and viewing preferences, thus allowing the client to visit client-only areas of our website without logging in again.

Cookies are useful for websites that have large databases, use logins or have customizable themes or other advanced features. Cookies usually do not contain much information except for the Uniform Resource Locator (URL) of the website that created the cookie, the duration of the cookie's abilities and effects, and a random number. Because of the little amount of information a cookie contains, a cookie usually cannot be used to reveal the identity of a user or any personally identifying information of the user.

Blocking and Use of Cookies

Our website issues and uses cookies immediately upon a user's landing on the website, unless the user has changed the cookie settings in their browser to refuse cookies. Visitors to our website can usually set their web browsers to inform them when cookies are enabled, or to disable cookies. If you do not wish to receive cookies when you visit our website, your web browser may permit you to decline or disable cookies, and in most cases you will still be allowed complete access to our website, though you may be required to provide certain information that cookies would have automatically provided. Our clients can also control how cookies are placed on their devices via the Clients Cookies Setting on this website. Again, if a client disables cookies, the client may be required, with each visit to the website, to provide certain information that the cookies would have automatically provided.

International Finance Asia Ltd. uses cookies to improve website user experience, to make this website work correctly and efficiently, to enable website security, and to provide us with information about the use of the website. We do not use cookies to collect personally identifiable information about users of the website. The cookies we use collect only anonymous information about website users. We use that anonymous information only to optimize our website services.

Cookies in Emails

In addition to the cookies used on this website, we may also use cookies and similar technologies in some emails with our clients. These help us to understand whether a client has opened an email and how the client has interacted with the email. If a client has enabled images, cookies may be set on the client's computer or mobile device. Cookies may also be set if a client clicks on any link within an email from us.

What happens to cookies that have been downloaded in the past?

If a client has disabled one or more cookie categories, International Finance Asia Ltd. may still use information collected from existing cookies, but we will stop using the disabled cookies to gather any further information. A client can delete existing cookies from their browser.

International Finance Asia Ltd. Website Cookie types and Description

According to purpose cookies could be categorized into: session, analytical and functional cookies.

Session cookies save website 'session' credentials for users both logged in and not logged in. Once the browser is closed, the cookie is deactivated - and the session closed.

Analytical cookies (persistent cookies) collect user's information, such as the number of visits, how destination website was found, from where the visit came from (origin), if via a marketing campaign etc.

Functional cookies (persistent cookies) are specifically about users experience on the website. For example they 'remember' the open/closed status of pop up messages, enabling access to information stored when registered and so on.

According to origin cookies could be categorized into own (i.e. 1st Party) and third party cookies.

Third Party cookies are set by other websites who place cookies on the user's computer. The "3rd party" cookies are placed when users are logged into their service with third parties (Google for instance). These cookies are session and persistent, and determine if the user is logged into a social network already, and control bookmarking or sharing content. Other third parties should be contacted directly to view their cookie privacy policy.

Targeted Advertising cookies are set by web publishers, advertising networks and service providers to deliver ads on other websites. Cookies may be used to serve you with advertisements that may be relevant to you and your interests on other web sites and to regulate the advertisements you receive and measure their effectiveness.
